10 Things Every Candoronian Should Know About the N.C. Peach Festival

You, as a resident of Candor, are a very big part of something really special! Our unique identity, which began over 125 years ago, flourishes within our peach growing heritage.

- 1.) Candor, North Carolina is the only designated town to be named the "Peach Capital of North Carolina". That's our brand. That's our point of reference. It's our source of pride. You are a part of it and we want you to be proud!
- 2.) It all began in the late 1800's when "Mr. H.R. Clark of Aberdeen, along with J.G. Tomlinson, A.W.E. Capel, and J.R. Page (prominent Montgomery County citizens), formed the Candor Fruit Company. An organization that was the first of its kind and would support peach growing on a commercial scale. In 1902, Mr. Clark purchased acreage below Candor and set out 30,000 young peach trees to start the first commercial peach orchard. From that point on, the peach industry thriv-

ed in the Candor and Sandhills region of North Carolina." - Pattern of Timeless Moments, Mable S. Lassiter.

- 3.) In 1996, The N.C. Department of Agriculture sanctioned that the Town of Candor would be the purveyor of the official N.C. Peach Festival. This was accomplished with the help of then, Montgomery Co. Agricultural Extension Agent, Susan Hamilton. (To be clear, this is NOT the "Candor Peach Festival". We have an official designation by the State of North Carolina as THE N.C. Peach Festival. It's a pretty big deal and something to be proud of as a community!)
- 4.) The very first "Peach Festival" was held in 1996 at Candor Elementary School. That year, unfortunately, there were no peaches, so it was more of a fruit festival. We've done a lot of growing in the last 26 years!
- 5.) Did you know there is a N.C. Peach Grower's Society? The organization is

- made up of peach growers from several areas including, Montgomery, Moore, Richmond, Anson & Union counties. The N.C. Peach Festival is organized to support our state's peach growers!
- 6.) The N.C. Peach Festival is now 3 days long Thursday, Friday, & of course, always the 3rd Saturday in July.
- 7.) The Town of Candor has a population of 840 and hosts this festival with roughly 10,000+ attendees.
- 8.) Our parade that is held on Saturday, before the start of the N.C. Peach Festival, is an hour long and is one of the best parades around!

STOP

If you pour it down your kitchen or bathroom sink (or even your toilet) it does the same thing and causes severe clogging to YOUR plumbing and the TOWN sewer system. Please pour your used grease and oil into collection containers, such as old jars or cans, and seal them when possible. You can even insert paper towels into the jar/can with the grease to help soak it up. THEN DISPOSE OF THOSE CONTAINERS IN THE TRASH. In the long run, this will save us all a lot of time and money. REMINDER...

Water bills are due by the 19th of each month, after that, a late fee of \$10 will be applied to your bill. The final day to pay your bill is the 25th, at which point your water will be turned off, if unpaid. To have your water turned back on, you will have to pay a \$50 Re-Connect Fee, in addition to the unpaid balance & late fee. Avoid fees by paying your water bill on time each month. A Bit of History...

From the RICHMOND COUNTY JOURNAL (July 14, 1949) "Latest Innovation In The Peach Industry Is The Use Of Airplanes For The Shipments Of Fruit - Much has been said about the beginning of the peach industry in the Sandhill section which covers parts of Montgomery, Moore, Scotland and Richmond counties. In the 1920's the peach industry was undergoing growing pains like any other industry...they had their ups and downs, much like the growers still have today. There were late frosts, hail storms, and plant diseases then too. Huge packing warehouses were being constructed near the orchards and railroad sidings were being built within a few feet of the orchards.

Yes, the rails were the method of transportation and the growers and distributors had another problem on their hands. How to get the fruit to market with less spoilage. Then on June 20th of this year (1949) at a small airport near Candor a C-46 type airplane landed about 6:40 p.m. and in approximately an hour later the plane became airborne with the first load of peaches to be shipped from North Carolina by air. The peach industry had taken another step toward bringing better fruit to the market. The peaches that were shipped were placed on New York City street markets and sold the next morning..."

PEACH GLAZED SALMON

- 1 C butter (cubed)
- 1 C peach preserves
- 1 TB lime juice
- 1 garlic clove (minced)
- 1 ts of prepared mustard
- 2 salmon fillets
- 1/2 C fresh peaches (sliced)

Combine butter and peach preserves, microwave on high for approximately 50 seconds. Stir in the next 3 ingredients. Set aside 1 cup of peach mixture. Place fillets in plastic bag and remaining peach mixture. Coat and marinate for 30 minutes.

Lightly coat grill rack with oil. Discard marinade and place fillets on grill - skin side down. Grill over medium heat for approximately 5 minutes. Spoon 1/2 of reserved peach mixture over fillets and grill for 10 to 15 minutes longer, basting frequently.

Serve with fresh sliced peaches and remaining peach mixture.

Did You Know...

"Peaches, or *Prunus persica* - are small fruit with a fuzzy peel and a sweet white or yellow flesh. They're thought to have originated in China more than 8,000 years ago. Peaches are related to plums, apricots, cherries, and almonds. They're considered drupes or stone fruit because their flesh surrounds a shell that houses an edible seed."
